

“Dappled Apples”

1. Make a colorful stand – up fall tree. Crumple small pieces of paper (orange, yellow, red, brown) and glue them to a large paper plate. When the glue is dry, cut slits in one end of toilet tissue roll and insert the paper plate.
2. Get a couple of rakes and allow children to gather up leaves in a pile. Then you can jump in them.
3. Johnny Appleseed Spread
Spread peanut butter on toast. Spoon 1 tbs. applesauce in center of toast. Sprinkle cinnamon sugar and sesame seeds or raisins on top.
4. Try different varieties of apples.
5. Sort, compare, taste and graph childrens favorites.
6. Take a trip to a pumpkin patch.
7. Make a dress up box. Combine old clothes, purses, shoes, scarves, old jewelry, hats, eye glasses. Place and store in suitcase, old box, storage bin. Allow children to bring out for a while during the day and create!
